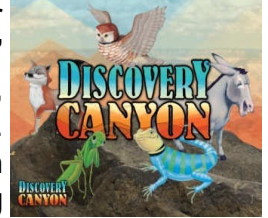
teacher; this coming fall with a very special full time assignment. And, yes, she is a kayaker -- a paddling adventurer with husband, Lee!

## Ministry of Visitation Greeting Cards!

Last fall nine members of CTS pondered together over a five-week period things like confidentiality, praying with others, and listening. These servants have since been bringing Holy Communion to people who are homebound or hospitalized and lending an ear to those requesting one. You have seen these nine carrying the consecrated bread and wine following our own sharing as a gathered community.

This group of visitation ministers has continued to come together once a month for further skill building and mutual support. Often there is brainstorming about ways to best serve. Last month it was suggested that we have greeting cards available in the narthex. Sometimes the congregation learns on Sunday morning of a hospitalization or other need. Often it would be nice if many people could sign together a card to let someone know “we are praying for you”.

A small supply of cards is now available in the narthex labeled “Visitation Ministry Greeting Cards”. Here’s how it works:

- o You identify someone in need of encouragement.
- o Before worship select a card and label the card and envelope with the person’s name. (do not add too many particulars in order to respect privacy. If you have permission from the person you may include something general like “surgery” or “at the death of ...”).
- o Leave card on the table with the “please sign this card” tent to encourage others to sign.
- o After worship and some fellowship time retrieve the card and kindly mail it to the recipient.

### 2009 National Youth Gathering

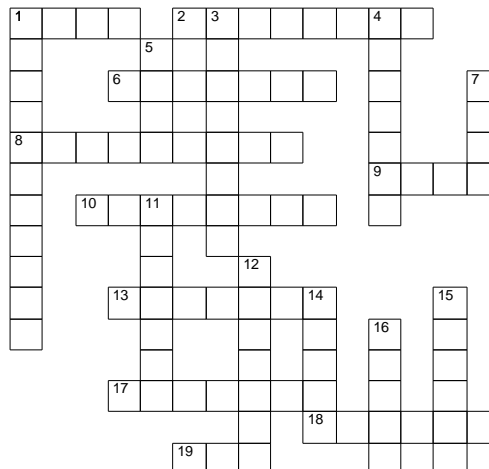

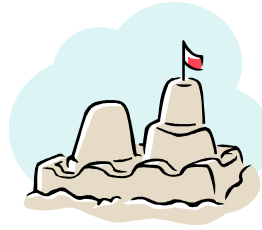

Little plastic buckets and shovels at a sandy ocean beach with kids or grandkids! How we love to put all that energy into creating our sand castles and then watch the tides sweep them away.



It is one thing to watch our little sand castles get swept away, but oh those elaborate sand sculptures! How could the artists let *those* be destroyed?

Or what about the Buddhist practice of creating sand mandalas? Every grain of sand is put in place with great care to form a breath-taking work of art. Then when the piece is complete, prayers are said and the whole thing is intentionally swept away in an instant. What a shame!

But that misses the point. All of these art forms are lessons in impermanence. No matter what we build, the earth will eventually reclaim it. In the end, we are all just playing in the sand.

Further it was resolved that we communicate with state and national representatives and officials to encourage Israel to move toward ending their occupation of the West Bank and economic siege of Gaza moving toward a just and peaceful two state solution.

### Human Sexuality Study Document

It was resolved that our synod memorialize to the Churchwide Assembly to adopt the proposed Social Statement on Human Sexuality and that the Vocation and Education unit be directed to develop procedures regarding rostering for persons in same-gender relationships.

The Resolution requesting that Churchwide Assembly adopt a super-majority for voting was not adopted.

The festival worship service included a mass choir where some of our own CTS singers were heard! This new format for assembly is open to everyone and YOU are warmly invited and enthusiastically encouraged to plan ahead to participate next year.
