





#### **Invitation to Communion**


The risen Christ is made known to us in the breaking of the bread. Come and eat at God's table.

Anytime during communion you may visit the prayer station in the narthex where a prayer partner will confidentially hold your request in prayer, also offering a prayer shawl and anointing with oil if desired.

Tribalism occurs within every facet of human life. Borders are created around nations, states, towns, neighborhoods, religious affiliations, schools, grades in school, levels of education, groups of belonging and un-belonging. Human beings evolved within tribes. For thousands upon thousands of years living within tribes improved our chances of survival. Our deeply ingrained tribal patterning is at this time in human history turning against us to the degree that it threatens our future survival. Come hear from Paul and engage in discussion.

#### May 19 - Christian Nationalism

Christian nationalism is a cultural framework that idealizes and advocates a fusion of Christianity with American civic life. Christian nationalism contends that America has been and should always be distinctively "Christian" from top to bottom – in its self-identity, interpretations of its own history, sacred symbols, cherished values, and public policies – and it aims to keep it that way. But the "Christian" in Christian nationalism is more about identity than religion. It carries with it assumptions about nativism, white supremacy, authoritarianism, patriarchy, and militarism.
